It might get boring.


Further analysis reveals that if my spending patterns remain the same, I could save roughly \$6,000 by working 30 hr/wk in carpentry. However, my disability would be compromised. Analysis on the Graphic Design front reveals that, if I worked 20 hr/wk at T.J. Maxx while in school, I'd be \$400 in the hole each month. Time budget studies reveal that if I returned to school full-time, I'd spend approximately 46 hr/wk working & studying. I've learned that this is too much for me. However, if I go part-time, my hours would be 34 hr/wk, which is doable. I wouldn't lose disability benefits and I'd end up with a lucrative career sooner. My mind always changes, but right now I think Graphic Design, straight, no chaser, is the way to go. Stay tooned!

I read a website, <u>ariseandshine.org</u>, about how the "Son of Sam" killer became a Christian. In 1976-1977 David Berkowitz, the Son of Sam, murdered many people with a .44 caliber gun. He terrorized the city of New York. He had sold his soul to the devil. But God rescued him from the depth of his sin and now he is a vital and alive Christian! I encourage you to watch his testimony video. When they captured him, one police officer asked him, "Are you glad it's over?" And he said, "Yes." He went through a ten year period of depression about his crimes and then someone gave him a pocket Bible. He read Psalm 34:6 which says, "This poor man called, and the LORD heard him; He saved him out of all his troubles." And he prayed and prayed and God did save him! Not from the temporal consequences of his sins, but from the eternal consequences of depravity. Although I never murdered anyone, I can relate to this man because, in my former life, I lived in the dark. I did what I wanted and lived the lie that told me I was god. But now I am alive also!

As I write this, I listen to <u>The Hand That Feeds</u> by Trent Reznor (Nine Inch Nails). I must confess: NIN is one of my guilty pleasures. This man sings of his hatred in a way that is very inviting and powerful. I pray for people like him, because if this is the power of music he makes for depravity, how wonderful could his music for God be! He is very creative. I pray the same thing for Björk. Her music captivated me while I was in the throws of self-idolization. Now I recognize I heard what I wanted to from her music, and it led me astray. I can't listen to much of her music anymore, for the things that led me to sin still hold that power of hurt. I pray for her too, though, because she is so wonderfully creative and I long to hear what she can do for Christ. I know I pray for wrong reasons (I want good music), but I do.

It was easier than I thought. This begins my Big Brother in Christ efforts. Mt. Calvary calls it "Inside Out", I believe. Though unrelated to my efforts, the Big Brother Big Sister website states that a Little Brother who has been mentored one or more years has a substantially increased chance to graduate high school, attend college, show respect to more adults and avoid alcohol, drugs and violence. Furthermore, the child who comes to know God's love sooner avoids more problems later, a lesson I've learned from my own direct experience.
